Anton Polezhayev, Violin; NSSO Artist-in-Residence and

Violinist Anton Polezhayev won "Grand Prix" at the International Violin Competition of Pierre Lantier in Paris, France, 1997, as well as numerous other competitions, awards and scholarships. Mr. Polezhayev was a member of the New York Philharmonic from 2002 to 2004, and prior to the Philharmonic, a member of the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra from 2000 to 2002. In addition to his recital and teaching schedule, Anton Polezhayev currently holds the position of Associate Concertmaster with Orchestra Sinfonica do Estado de Sao Paulo, Brazil.

As a soloist and recitalist Mr. Polezhayev was featured on the cover of Part 2 of Newsday on October 21, 1992, and the New York Times on January 18, 2004, and has performed on radio and television. His credits also include performances at the International Concert Series at Hofstra University, Tilles Center, Alice Tully Hall in New York City, and numerous concert halls in Europe and Russia. Mr. Polezhayev was educated at the Manhattan School of Music where he studied with Dr. Albert Markov (1993-1999) and Principal Associate Concertmaster of New York Philharmonic Ms. Sheryl Staples (1999-2001). Mr. Polezhayev was born in St. Petersburg, Russia, in 1976, and at age 5 began his violin studies at the Central Music School of Moscow State Conservatory. Mr. Polezhayev was re-appointed as the Artist-in-Residence with the North Shore Symphony Orchestra for the 2010-2011 season.



Carl Strommen - composer/arranger

Carl Strommen's contributions to band, orchestra, jazz band and vocal music make him one of the most performed composer/arrangers, nationally and internationally. His music is heard regularly in concert settings, television, and film. A resident of Glen Head, New York, Carl Strommen is currently on the music faculty of C.W. Post Campus of Long Island University, where he teaches graduate orchestration, composition and arranging. A graduate of C.W. Post Campus of Long Island University and City College of New York, he is an internationally regarded composer/arranger for Warner Bros. and Carl Fischer Publishing. He has been awarded countless commission assignments of all styles and settings, and has been a consistent winner of the yearly

Writers Award, presented by the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers.

NSSO has been fortunate to have the talented and experienced Jeong-Yoon Park as Principal Cellist for the past two seasons. Ms. Park comes to NSSO having trained and performed widely on the international music scene.

Educated in South Korea and Germany, she holds a Ph.D. in music from the Hochschule fur Musik in Wuerzburg, Germany, a Master's from Detmold, Germany, and a BA degree from Seoul National University.

Ms. Park's artistry has been recognized with several awards, including a First Prize in the Korean Times Competition and the Tibor Varga Scholarship from the Swiss Lion's Club. An active performer and recitalist, she has appeared with the Seoul Philharmonic Orchestra, as Principal Cellist with the Seoul Metropolitan Orchestra, as soloist with the Seoul Metropolitan Youth Orchestra, and with the Yewon Orchestra and Detmold Kammerorchstra. She has also been a faculty member in the Gloville Conservatory of Dongduk Women's University and is currently on the faculty of the Long Island Conservatory.

Timothy Carl is a busy professional musician on Long Island. He serves as the assistant director and accompanist for the North Shore Community Chorus. He has been with the group since 1997. Mr. Carl is also the accompanist for the Bel Canto Chorale, a volunteer chorus based in Wantagh. He is entering his third season with this group. Mr. Carl frequently appears as piano soloist in both group's regular concert series.



Mr. Carl also serves as Music Director for Saint Dominic's Parish in Oyster Bay where he conducts various choirs and musical ensembles along with performing during mass on the pipe organ. He is also the Choral Director for Port Jewish Center in Port Washington. He has been affiliated with both institutions since 1996.

Mr. Carl has performed twice at St Peter's Basilica in Rome and also at St Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. He was soloist for the North Shore Community Choir's 2004 performance of Beethoven's 'Choral Fantasy'. Mr. Carl attended the prestigious Manhattan School of Music where he studied under the famous pedagogue Constance Keene. He was a 1993 scholarship graduate earning his Master's Degree in Performance. He makes his home in Port Washington with his wife and three children.
